Per previous Updates: Longer Guarantee Period remains to be considered/decided by the Minister. The WP has no indication on this matter; last update from DfT was a



repeat of previous advice as to the matter being separate to the general SROH review, and a matter for Ministers.

Noted that Transport Scotland have stated the 6-year period in Scotland is expected to come into effect in 2023. Awaiting steer on how necessary SROR change requirements

Next meeting

Utilities-side have prepared a first-draft of a co-ordinated Overview for Industry prior to Implementation. Currently with joint-chairs for review.
